pril is here and I could not be any happier. I am excited as it, from a school standpoint, represents a time of reflection and recognition for our students.



Veterans Memorial Brick to Honor Veterans




You can still purchase an engraved sidewalk brick for the memorial to honor a Veteran. A contribution of \$100



With spring fast approaching we all are looking forward to the color of green. For those involved with the development of pickleball courts in the

Village of Spencer, we are looking forward to the color of black, which is blacktopping the six pickleball courts at the ARC Park! With our various fund raising efforts, we are happy to announce that with the public donations from ten contributors we were able to raise \$5,300 meeting the matching funds of \$5,000 donated by Terry and Cindy Prust. In addition, we had \$2.150 donated by five area businesses and were



awarded a second grant of \$5,000 from the Marshfield Area Community Foundation, Inc. bringing our grant totals to \$7,000.

With this project there have been many service-in-kind donations which is done at no cost. These include project design, engineering, project management and other items of Phase One. In other words, from the initial ground breaking to the final lawn seeding, this project will be covered by service-in-kind donations with the exception of the blacktop and the equipment which was paid for with memorial funds. We now stand at the ½ way mark having raised \$19,450 of the \$38,750 needed for the blacktop planned for early June 2023.

STAGE PROJECT UPDATE We are still in the process of raising funds to build the 1st Phase of the Band Stage. Project "Day" Dream on behalf of the

Day family is underway! Another \$25,000 matching program has been offered because of a very generous donation by Tom Day, a Spencer Alumni. Tom would like to see additional Spencer Alumni donate to meet his match so the project can happen. To date, we have \$59,800 and are waiting to see if we are awarded the \$50,000 grant that was submitted. This \$50,000 (match and funds) will help us get much closer to the total 1st Phase project which is estimated at over \$300,000.
